To maximize participation, C.O.L.O.R. will be a smaller event this year and follow a cost-sharing model. This means: Applicants are invited to contribute \$500 toward their participation (a "cost-share") Applicants can reference our funding guide for tips to request funds externally. Any accepted applicants who are unable to secure the cost-share, will be fully funded by SACNAS. The application will be competitive. How does SACNAS/my chapter participate in advocacy?	All SACNAS chapters are officially recognized student organizations on your campus. Therefore, while chapter members are welcome to organize and/or participate in advocacy activities, chapters should first make sure you know your institutional policies, guidelines, and practices for advocacy. Partner with your Government Relations and Student Affairs offices at your institution. As a private citizen, contact your elected officials—local, state, and national representatives—share the impact on you and your community. At the national level, SACNAS partners with other organizations to advocate for STEM, such as sign-on letters, coalitions, and partnerships.
