

Donna Maria Blancero is a professor of management and organizational leadership and recently stepped down from her role as Vice President of Academic Affairs and Provost at Bentley University. Previously, she served as Dean of Business and Dean of the Graduate School at Bentley. During her tenure, she was one of three Latina business deans at AACSB-accredited universities in the United States. Her work is driven by a strong commitment to social justice and advancing access, representation, and opportunity in higher education and the workplace.

Donna Maria is a Fellow of the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching and has received numerous national and institutional honors, including the National Society of Hispanic MBAs Brillante Award for Hispanic Education, the National Black MBA Association Educator Award, the MLK Leadership Award from Bentley University, and two SACNAS Presidential Awards (2010 and 2018). She earned her PhD from Cornell University and was the first Latina to graduate with a doctorate from Cornell's ILR School.

Her research examines the experiences and career trajectories of underrepresented professionals in corporate settings and has been widely published. She is also the author of *Hispanics at Work: A Collection of Research, Theory and Application*.
